



East Gate Traffic Improvement Now in Place

Residents using the East Gate are now seeing the benefits of a long-awaited traffic improvement with the installation of new “Do Not Block” pavement striping on Military Trail. The markings are designed

to improve traffic flow by keeping the intersection at East Drive clear when southbound traffic backs up at the traffic signal. Motorists traveling on Military Trail are prohibited from stopping inside the marked box if

doing so would block vehicles attempting to exit Century Village East. A new roadside sign has also been installed facing southbound traffic, reminding drivers to keep the boxed area clear whenever

traffic is stopped. One question frequently asked by residents is whether drivers exiting the East Gate are allowed to pull into the marked box while waiting for southbound traffic to begin moving

again. The answer is yes. The purpose of the box is to provide a safe space for vehicles leaving the Village to enter the southbound lanes while preventing

MM Paper Coupon Books Ending for 2027 Payments

CVE Master Management will discontinue mailing annual paper coupon books to residents beginning with monthly maintenance payments due in January 2027, reflecting the community’s continued transition to electronic payment methods. For many years, residents who paid their monthly assessments by check

received coupon books in the mail at the end of each year. Those coupons could be enclosed with a check and mailed to CVE Master Management for processing. According to CVE Master

Management officials, the vast majority of residents now make their monthly payments electronically, either through online banking, automatic bill pay, recurring payments or other digital payment

methods. As a result, only a small percentage of residents still rely on the printed coupon books. Officials said the decision

Accessibility Improvements Completed at Tilford Pool and Le Club

Residents visiting the Tilford Pool will now find new accessibility improvements designed to make the facility more convenient for everyone. CVE Master Management has completed the

installation of ADA-assisted entry doors at the Tilford Pool restroom facilities. The new system allows the doors to open automatically with the push of a button, making the restrooms easier to access for residents and guests

with mobility challenges or anyone who may need additional assistance. An additional accessibility improvement has also been completed at Le Club, where the main entrance has been upgraded with an ADA-

assisted door to provide easier access for residents and visitors. The projects are part of CVE Master Management’s ongoing efforts to enhance accessibility throughout Century Village East and ensure that community

amenities remain welcoming and easy to use for all residents.

through traffic from blocking the intersection.
The project represents the culmination of nearly eight years of advocacy by CVE Master Management.
The effort began in 2018, shortly after the new East Gate opened, when CVE Master Management first approached Broward County about installing the “Do Not Block” striping. The initiative gained momentum in 2021 after CVE Master Management successfully worked with the county to add a dedicated right-turn lane into the East Gate from Military Trail.
Throughout the process, CVE Master Management Board President Eli Okun met repeatedly with Broward County Commissioner Mark Bogen to keep the project moving forward. Board members also visited other communities where similar traffic markings had already been implemented, gathering information that helped strengthen the case for bringing the same solution to Century Village East.
A recent change in Florida law ultimately made the project possible. Recognizing the opportunity, CVE Master Management Board Member Barry Warhoftig worked with county officials to secure final approval.
CVE Master Management will also fund enforcement by the Broward Sheriff’s Office. Deputies will issue citations to motorists who stop inside the marked box, helping ensure the intersection remains clear for residents exiting the community.
The new pavement markings are expected to improve traffic flow and make it easier and safer for residents to leave Century Village East during periods of heavy traffic.

Damaged Hillsboro Wall Section Replaced

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A section of the decorative wall along Hillsboro Boulevard that was damaged when a vehicle struck it has been repaired and restored.

The damaged portion was

part of the new wall installed within the past year along Hillsboro Boulevard. Thanks to the wall's modular design, repairs were completed by replacing only the affected panel rather than rebuilding a

larger section of the structure. The wall was constructed in individual sections, allowing damaged panels to be removed and replaced without disturbing the surrounding portions of

the wall. The design helps simplify repairs, reduce costs and minimize disruption when accidents occur. The newly installed replacement panel restores the appearance and continuity

of the wall, which serves as an attractive gateway feature along Hillsboro Boulevard.

to discontinue the annual mailing was made to reduce printing and mailing costs while recognizing the widespread use of online payment options. This change does not apply to payments of coupons

to CenClub or individual associations. All these entities handle their billing practices separate from CVE Master Management. The change does **not** affect residents who prefer to pay by check. CVE Master Management will continue to accept payments by mail. The

only change is that printed coupon books will no longer be produced and mailed to residents. To assist those who still wish to include a payment coupon with their check, printable coupons will be made available on the CVE Master Management website

later this year. Residents will be able to download and print the coupons themselves for use throughout 2027. CVE Master Management plans to launch a public information campaign later this year to ensure residents are aware of the upcoming change and understand the

payment options that will remain available. Officials emphasized that while the method of distributing coupons is changing, residents will continue to have multiple convenient ways to pay their monthly assessments.

Firefighter Challenge Coming to Deerfield Beach

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Some of the nation’s top firefighter athletes will compete in Deerfield Beach next month as the city hosts the inaugural Southeast Region Classic of the TFT® Firefighter Challenge Championship Series.

The three-day event will take place Aug. 20-22 at the Main Beach Parking Lot, 149 SE 21st Ave., and is free and open to the public.

Firefighters from across the country will test their speed, strength and endurance in a series of events designed to simulate the physical demands of emergency response. ESPN has dubbed the competition “the toughest two minutes in sports.”

Competitors, wearing full turnout gear and self-contained breathing apparatus, will complete a challenging obstacle course that includes climbing a five-story tower, hoisting equipment, forcing entry with a weighted hammer, advancing charged fire hoses and rescuing a life-sized, 165-pound victim.

The championship is open to career, volunteer, retired, cadet and junior firefighter/explorer participants. Athletes will compete in individual, tandem and relay events, with divisions based on age, gender and skill level.

According to organizers, the competition highlights

the physical demands of the fire service while recognizing firefighters who dedicate themselves to maintaining peak physical fitness.

The event is presented by the First Responder Institute, a nonprofit organization that promotes firefighter fitness, recognizes excellence in the fire service and encourages future generations to pursue careers in emergency services.

Competition begins Thursday, Aug. 20, with qualifying rounds and the Southeast Region title competition. Tandem and relay events are scheduled for Friday, Aug. 21. Saturday, Aug. 22, begins with an opening

ceremony at 8 a.m., followed by the individual competitions.

Admission is free, and spectators are invited to attend throughout the weekend to watch firefighters from across the country compete while demonstrating the skills they rely on every day to protect their communities.

Tips for Traveling

Be Practical When Packing

Pack light. For a person traveling with at least some limitation, aim to pack everything necessary in a roll-aboard suitcase plus a medium size over-the-shoulder carry-on. Do not check the roll-aboard as luggage, as in-cabin flight staff will gladly stash it in the overhead rack. Such will save a lot of time at the final destination airport.

All prescription and over-the-counter medications should be placed in a one quart zip lock freezer bag, including also copies of any prescriptions and/or physician statements in the hand carry bag. Do not place the pill combinations separately into a separate plastic box as “the next combined dosage.” Such will never get through security. Enclose also any medical appliances such as extra braces or first-aid needs.

If toting gifts to relatives, do not wrap them. Place the items in the roll-aboard luggage.

Think about Safety, Security and Comfort

There are thieves everywhere and, particularly, in high-traffic travel centers. Don’t give the scalawags any opportunity to steal from you.

Women should not carry a purse but, instead, a money belt worn under a blouse or a neat Passage Wallet hidden under their coat by a neck cord. Men should not carry a wallet in his back pocket but, instead, the same Passage Wallet from the neck cord or as a hidden wallet tucked into his pants and secured by a cord to his belt.

If traveling alone, always keep your carry-on between your feet when standing, or with the shoulder strap looped around the leg of a chair when seated.

For comfort, consider the purchase of a travel pillow, a c-shaped balloon that supports the neck and head when resting aboard transportation.

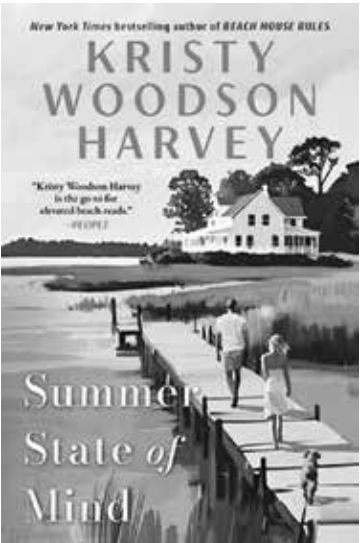

Yay! It's Mango Season!

A glorious time of year to have a sweet tooth. There are likely hundreds of ways to eat the luscious fruit, but for today, we will bring to life – Mango Shortbread Bars.

My comment was: “Gone in 60 seconds.”

The bars consist of a bottom shortbread layer, a gooey sweet mango center layer and a top shortbread layer. Sounds complex and looks like you spent hours on it, but it's not difficult at all. You can do it!

Mango Shortbread Bars

Yield: 1 9x13 inch baking dish

Ingredients

- 1 3/4 cups butter, softened

- 1/2 cup (over-flowing, almost 2/3 cup), white sugar
- 3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, sifted
- 4 cups sliced mango
- 1/4 cup white sugar
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 2 pinches ground nutmeg

Directions

- **Step 1:** Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- **Step 2:** In large bowl, cream together the first three ingredients and press 1/2 of the mixture into the bottom of a 9x13 inch baking dish. (Drop the dough into the pan, then cover with a sheet of parchment and press into the corners and around the pan

- as evenly as possible. Gently remove the parchment, et voile! A smooth even base remains.
- **Step 3:** In a medium bowl, stir together the last five ingredients until well combined. Pour this mango mixture over the shortbread layer in pan, spreading fairly evenly. Sprinkle the remaining shortbread mixture over mango mixture. Press down lightly.
 - **Step 4:** Bake 1 hour, until topping is golden brown and filling is bubbling all over. Let cool 15 minutes in dish before cutting into bars. Refrigerate or freeze leftovers.
 - **Note:** If your oven runs hot, check the bars at 50 minutes. The shortbread



topping should be golden brown but not burnt.
